Episodes

Senses is an educational podcast series focused on those who have a disability due to the loss of a sense. Each episode is based on a different sense, including Speech, Sight and Sound.



Episode 1 - Speech

In this episode, we focus on the speech. Simon who is the narrator of the Senses podcast had trouble with his speech as a young child, he takes us through his own experiences and how he overcame his speech problem. Simon sits down with his Mum to talk about her experience of having a child with a speech problem and taking her son to speech therapy. We also talk to Sarah and Sam who have both suffered from stuttering, they tell us their stories and how they both overcame their speech impediment. We also spoke to Michelle Baynham, a speech and language therapist who specialises in working with children with speech difficulties.



Episode 2 - Sound

In this episode, we focus on the sense of hearing and the sensation of sound. We talk to Megan who is a student at the University of Lincoln who is deaf in her left ear. She talks about how the university support her and she talks about her journey of having hearing problems and how she was able to get a hearing aid to improve her hearing dramatically. We also spoke to the Lincoln Deaf Children's Society a support group for parents with children who have hearing loss. We talked to some of the parents and they explained the importance of support for children with hearing loss. We also spoke George, an audiologist at Allhear in Lincoln, who gave us a professional opinion on sound and young people.

Episode 3 - Sight

In this episode, we focus on the sense of sight. We talk to Ben, a student at the University of Lincoln who is visually impaired. Ben talks about his day to day life and how he copes with being a visually impaired student. We also spoke to a charity called the Lincoln and Lindsey Blind Society who aim to help people like Ben to live a more comfortable and independent life. We also got the chance to talk to Di Vaughan who like Ben, is also visually impaired. Di is also one of the founders of the group Social Paws which is a social group for guide dog owners so they can meet up monthly as well as take part in other activities.
